

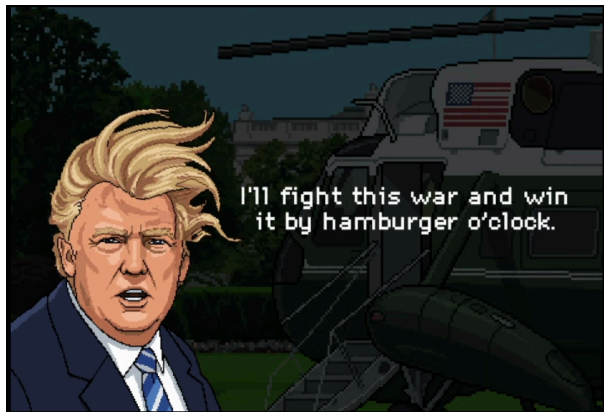
The project has also received widespread national press coverage.
